The Worship Experience 2



The Worship Experience 2 was just that -a worship experience! The Arc Benders, a partnership between First Presbyterian Church and Oxford First United Methodist Church, served as hosts for the evening.

About 15 years ago, Oxford First, then known as Burns United Methodist Church. held the first Worship Experience. The brainchild of Rev. Deborah Mingo Palmer. Worship Experience hosted the the Mississippi Mass Choir and an interdenominational, interracial choir to sing before the main event. Most of the choir members enjoyed participating, but the idea for a continuing community choir fizzled. Flash forward and the Arc Benders were seeking a community event that could bring the races together on one accord. One of the members who had participated in the previous choir suggested a similar event and

the Worship Experience 2 was born.

For Worship Experience 2, we recruited approximately 30 singers from both Oxford First and First Presbyterian, but also additional churches including, Beverly United Methodist Church, Buford Chapel United Methodist Church, and Providence United Methodist Church. Right from the start, choir members expressed enthusiasm for the overall vision. After 2 joint practices, we sang together on February 18, 2024.

Reverend Roger Wilson welcomed the audience and recognized the number of churches represented. Rev. Barrett Milner led the congregation in prayer. Then Karen Peairs gave the occasion by lifting up Galatians 3:28 which says "In Christ's family, there can be no division into Jew and non-Jew, slave and free, male and female. Among us, you are all equal. That is, we are all in a common relationship with Jesus Christ." Julie Chadwick and Erma Goolsby presented that same Scripture in different versions. Then, Choir Director Rodney Buford and Director of Music, Creighton Holder led the combined choir in six musical selections. As the music culminated in a rousing rendition of "Do Not Pass Me By," the Holy Spirit fell – again it was a true Worship Experience! As the Mistress of Ceremonies reminded the audience repeatedly – "This is what Heaven will look like."

Special Thanks to our musicians, who all came together to provide beautiful music, and to the kitchen crew who provided more than enough food for our packed audience. Thanks to "Creed" for her beautiful solo. As so many people said, this was the first but it won't be the last of the Worship Experience Choir.
