I am just overwhelmed with sufficient grace as I have never seen it before. Shall I accept Antonio Josiah that's been a blessing and a joy and not an unforeseen disaster that left my family homeless and challenges my faith but yet has brought me blessings and joy, unexplainable joy that I know the best is still yet to come? I believe in God's Word when he said "It is written, eyes have not seen, nor ears heard, nor have entered into the heart of man, the things God have prepared for those who love him, (1 Corinthians 29). No, we are not in the league with Job but God can restore just as He did for Job. What the fire destroyed are ashes of yesterday.
